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Osborn-Parnes Creative Problem Solving (CPS) More specifically, the term creative problem solving may refer to the Osborn-Parnes process of CPS invented by Dr. Sidney J. Parnes and Alex Osborn back in the late 1950s. This models of CPS consists of three main stages, each of which contains several smaller but explicitly defined steps:

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For example, Osborn coined the term "brainstorming," probably the most popular technique in problem-solving today. According to the Creative Education Foundation, two assumptions underlie the Osborn-Parnes creative problem-solving process. First, everyone is creative in some way; second, creative skills can be learned and enhanced over time.
